Dr. Erik Wingrove-Haugland's "Moral Sensitivity, Dehumanization, and the Military" will be published as Chapter 12 of *Developing Moral Sensitivity* (Mowrer, Vandenberg, and Robison, Eds; forthcoming Routledge 2015). The story of how this went from a conference presentation on philosophical conceptions of the rules of war to a book chapter on how military psychology can help prevent PTSD provides an excellent illustration of how scholarly work often evolves in response to the demands of editors and publishers, and ends up going far beyond the author's original intent.
