Dr. David Conlin, underwater archaeologist and Chief of the National Park Service's Submerged Resources Center will discuss shipwrecks from the second world war and the threat they pose to the marine environment. A current research partnership with scientists at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy seeks to understand, and perhaps mitigate, this environmental risk. This talk will focus on long-term interdisciplinary research being conducted on the wreck of USS Arizona, and discuss potential implications for this national memorial as well as other shipwrecks from WWII.
